Description

Purpose or significance of data

This is the raw data for the EPA's Environmental Justice Screening and Mapping Tool. The two csv files contain all the data, and the other files explain how to read the csv files.

Here's the EPA's description:

EJSCREEN allows users to access high-resolution environmental and demographic information for locations in the United States, and compare their selected locations to the rest of the state, EPA region, or the nation.

The tool may help users identify areas with:

Minority and/or low-income populations

Potential environmental quality issues

A combination of environmental and demographic indicators that is greater than usual

Other factors that may be of interest

EJSCREEN may also be used to support:

Educational programs

Grant writing

Community awareness efforts

Other purposes

This screening information may be of interest to community residents or other stakeholders as they search for environmental or demographic information and it can also support a wide range of research and policy goals. The public has used EJView, an earlier EPA environmental justice screening tool, in a variety of ways, and is likely to use EJSCREEN in many different ways as well.

EPA is sharing EJSCREEN with the public:

to be more transparent about how we consider environmental justice in our work,

to assist our stakeholders in making informed decisions about pursuing environmental justice and

to create a common starting point between the agency and the public when looking at issues related to environmental justice.

Screening tools should be used for a "screening-level" look. Screening is a useful first step in understanding or highlighting locations that may be candidates for further review. However, it is essential to remember that screening-level results:

do not, by themselves, determine the existence or absence of environmental justice concerns in a given location

they do not provide a risk assessment and

have other significant limitations.

- Do not harvest. All data is small, unstructured, and on a page crawlable by the Internet Archive.
- Page contains dynamic content (e.g., links loaded by JavaScript).
- Page contains interactive visualizations.
- Data is accessible in structured file(s) that can be directly downloaded.
- Data is accessible over FTP.
- Data is accessible using a documented public API.
- Data is only accessible using search queries in a web form.

Recommended approach to harvesting data

Few enough that manual individual downloads will work.
